Home Reading Records

This year, we will be using Go Read to log your child's reading at home. Go Read is a digital reading record.

Last week, your child received a letter from their class teacher which explained the app you need to download and the details you need to connect to your child's account.

Every week:

- After your child has read their reading book, click on the book in their Go Read account
- Log the number of pages read
- Add a comment about their reading in the app.
- Only click 'complete' when your child has finished their book.








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What's been happening in school this week




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Here are Year 5 enjoying BBC Schools PE/PSHE Live Lesson. Their favourite part was the PE lesson!

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Covid Reminder

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?	NO	 All children MUST attend school unless they are ill. From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a close contact has Covid. Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school while waiting for the result so long as they have no symptoms and once a negative the test result is received.
	YES	 If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at</u> <u>home</u> and should book a PCR test, <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow Test (LFT). If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.
		 If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated but instead should book a PCR test.
