
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#### We are in the season of Advent.


The Church's liturgical year begins with Advent, the four weeks prior to Christmas. It is a season of preparation, waiting, and anticipation. At mass for the first weekend of Advent, the first purple candle on the Advent Wreath is lit.

This candle signifies **hope** and sometimes, this candle, is referred to as the **Prophecy Candle**. During the first week we can have hope for the Messiah's arrival. We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God.







































































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#### Classroom Kitchen this week


