Our focus for this half-term is



This skill is all about how to communicate effectively with others, being mindful of whether they are talking to customers, colleagues or other stakeholders and in different settings.

Initially, this skill focuses on being able to speak clearly - first with well-known individuals and small groups and then with those who are not known.

The next stage is about being an effective speaker by making points logically, by thinking about what listeners already know and using appropriate language, tone and gesture.

Beyond that, individuals focus on speaking engagingly through use of facts and examples, visual aids, and their expression and gesture.


Beyond that stage, speakers will be adaptive to the response of their listeners and ready for different scenarios. The final steps focus on speaking influentially - using structure, examples, facts and vision to persuade listeners.





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This term in cooking lessons, the pupils will be cooking recipes from around the world and looking at how diets vary. This week Y5/6 and Y6 really enjoyed making focaccia bread which originates in Italy. They were amazed at how much the dough had risen after proofing! This is when the yeast in the dough is activated and the dough rises.

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Year 1, Year 1/2, Year 2/3 and Year 3 became Eco-Investigators when Lydia from Zoolab brought some special creatures to meet them. They looked at a variety of animals from across the world and discussed the effects of climate change on our world and how it impacts the animals.









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Reception class also spent some time with Lydia from ZooLab. She brought some special creatures to see them and told them a story called 'Naturetown' about three friends. The story explained how we can all look after God's wonderful creation-our planet by; putting litter in the bin, recycling paper and plastic, using less plastic, using less water by turning the taps off when cleaning our teeth, walking or cycling to school and stopping cutting down trees especially in the rainforest. Throughout the story they got to meet lots of different creatures, they even got to hold and stroke some! They really enjoyed their extra special story time!











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A massive thank you to Simon from **FLAT STAN First Aid** for delivering First Aid Training to our pupils this week. This was done over three days and all the children were focused on listening and learning about how they could help someone who is hurt or poorly. They learnt about the different ways to get help and what to do in an emergency. They were also taught what to do if someone

-has a lump or bump
-is bleeding,
-having a nose bleed,
-is burnt
-lying on the floor
-is choking
-is not breathing

Simon ran the workshops three years ago and was amazed at how much information those children had remembered. He loved our phrase' Sticky Knowledge' and could clearly see that the children had retained lots of knowledge to build on! Well done everyone.
