Lent 2022



We are now in the Season of Lent. This is the 40 days leading up to the most important feast in the Christian calendar, the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord at Easter. Lent is a time for renewing our faith, hope and love in God as well as finding new opportunities to turn back to God. It is a time to prepare, reflect, pray and give to others. Lent is a wonderful opportunity to spring clean our lives and start anew.



The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday when ashes are placed on the forehead in the sign of the cross. The ashes for Ash Wednesday are normally made from the palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. The children in Year 2/3 to Year 6 attended the parish Mass celebrated by Father Pat. The children in Reception to Year 1/2 attended an Ash Wednesday service in school. Father Pat distributed ashes at both with all the children and staff receiving the ashes on their forehead. Pope Francis explains that the ashes sprinkled on our heads remind us that we are dust. "Yet upon this dust of ours, God blew His Spirit of life."

Our 'Virtues to Live By' for the rest of the Spring term are Charity and Forgiveness. During Lent, we will be focusing on the virtue of Charity for the first three weeks followed by the virtue of Forgiveness for the last three weeks. Throughout Lent we fundraise for the Diocesan 'Good Shepherd' Appeal and our class charities. These acts of charity are a very real way of making a better world for others.



Pope Francis makes the following suggestions for fasting during Lent.







Virtues to Live By

Our remaining 'Virtues to Live By' for the Spring term are Charity (Love) and Forgiveness. For the next few weeks, we will be focusing on the virtue of **Charity**. True charity seeks to give and to love without needing anything back. Teach your children the acronym **JOY:** Jesus, Others, Yourself. They will find that as they grow in the virtue of charity, they will be happier and joy filled.

For World Book Day all the teachers swapped classes and read stories to the children in a different class during story time.













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
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World Book Day 2022




