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Covid-19 Update

Almost exactly two years ago, schools were closing for the start of the first lockdown. Numbers of Covid-positive cases are rising again, and we are really beginning to notice that in school so please be vigilant and careful, especially in crowded places.

It is no longer a 'legal' duty to isolate if an individual tests positive – however it is still recommended by government and Leeds LA that individuals do still follow the guidance and self-isolate. As before, they should isolate for 10 full days but can take LFD tests from day 5 and end isolation early if they have 2 consecutive negative results 24 hours apart and do not have a high temperature. Pupils will be provided with work to do at home if they are well enough to do it. Please note work online will only be provided for COVID purposes.

Please note rapid lateral flow tests are only for people who do not have symptoms so pupils who are unwell with or displaying Covid symptoms should <u>arrange for a PCR test.</u> In line with Government Guidance if your child has any of these 3 coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, you must book and have a PCR test as soon as possible:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- loss of sense of smell or taste
