
Listening

This skill is all about being able to effectively receive information - whether it comes from customers, colleagues or stakeholders.

Initially, the skill steps concentrate on being able to listen effectively to others - including remembering short instructions, understanding why others are communicating and recording important information.







Covid-19 Update


The risk assessment has now been updated in line with guidance from Leeds LEA. It is no longer a 'legal' duty to isolate if an individual tests positive – however it is still recommended by government and Leeds Local Authority that individuals **do still** follow the guidance and self-isolate. As before, they should isolate for 10 full days but can take LFD tests from day 5 and end isolation early if they have 2 consecutive negative results 24 hours apart and do not have a high temperature. Pupils will be provided with work to do at home if they are well enough to do it. Please note work online will only be provided for COVID purposes.

Please note rapid lateral flow tests are only for people who do not have symptoms so pupils who are unwell with or displaying Covid symptoms should arrange for a PCR test. In line with Government Guidance if your child have any of these 3 coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, you must book and have a PCR test as soon as possible:

- a high temperature
- · a new, continuous cough
- · loss of sense of smell or taste

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Our weekly cooking slot this week goes to Year 2/3 who made a delicious Red Pepper Salsa using another flavoursome recipe from Classroom Kitchen.










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Science Week cntinued.
