

Father Pat explained that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is like this - we can get rid of the rubbish, the things we have done wrong in our life by remembering to say sorry. The children were presented with a certificate and a prayer book as a reminder of this special occasion.

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Year 5 visited the outdoor Stations of the Cross and then re-enacted the story in class














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Our Chaplaincy Team and the Mini-Vinnies worked together to create a Holy Week Bag for each child to take home.


