Easter Traditions

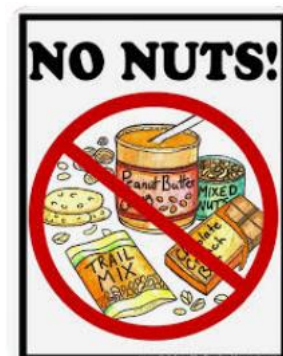
Advance notice to get busy!

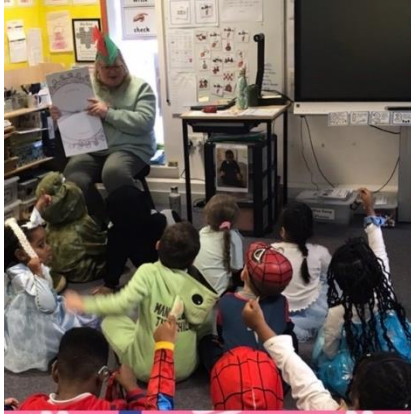

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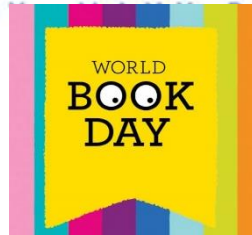
Each class welcomed a 'secret reader' at story time today. The teachers enjoyed swapping class to read a story to the children.
