

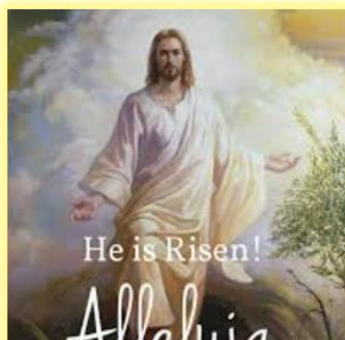

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What has been happening in school this week

Year 1, 1/2 and Year 2 cooking

This half term, Year 1, Year 1/2 and Year 2 are learning about the Republic of Zambia in their Geography lessons. This week, they have made a delicious Zambian beef stew and nshima. Nshima is the staple food in Zambia. It is made from mealie meal (cornmeal) that has been processed into powder. It is prepared by mixing only two ingredients, the mealie meal and water boiling and stirring until it thickens. Nshima is eaten by making a ball and pressing it in the middle to make a spoon-like shape. The children then used the nshima to scoop the stew to eat both together. Everyone enjoyed learning about the Republic of Zambia and tasting a traditional Zambian meal. It proved a bit hit with the children!

Year 6 made a delicious focaccia bread this week. They learnt how to knead the dough and used rosemary to add extra flavour. Delicious!



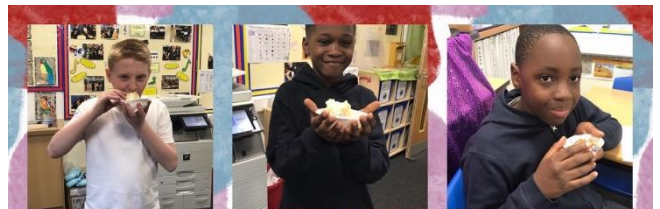
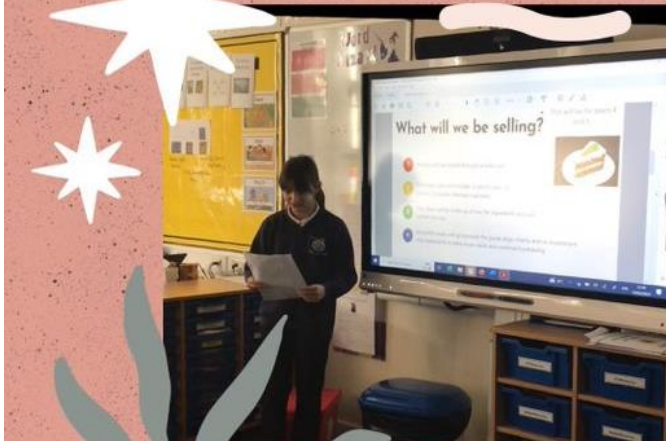

Pupil Premium

Have your circumstances changed recently - making you eligible to apply for Free School Meals (FSM) and milk?

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to school for any child who is or has been in receipt of FSM.

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Uniform reminders

The information below is from the school's uniform policy and applies to **all children** in school.

Hair Styles

Hair styles should be neat and tidy. Children should not come to school with hairstyles that are attention seeking for example hair gel, beaded hairstyles, closely shaved hair/shaved patterns including tramlines and patterns or unnatural colours etc. Hair should be tied up with suitable hair accessories. This is essential for PE and recommended throughout the school day. This policy is followed to minimise the risk of injury and to avoid the spread of headlice.

Jewellery

In the interests of health and safety, the wearing of jewellery in school is NOT ALLOWED. If children have pierced ears, only small stud type earrings are acceptable. These should be removed on PE/swimming days; if your child can not remove their own earrings, please make sure they do not wear them on PE/swimming days Also please note no make-up , no nail polish, no false nails-gels or otherwise, no false eyelashes, no tattoos or transfers.

Footwear- Please avoid expensive brands.

Pupils are required to wear sensible black shoes or plain black trainer style shoes (no coloured logo) as their outdoor shoes. Please ensure that these shoes are appropriate, not slip-ons, high heels or open-toed shoes. **Children should not wear shoes with laces unless they are able to tie them independently**
