

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




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Eight of our talented Year 5

After creatively describing some of the Viking objects, the children sold them for as much profit as they could before sealing the deal with a Viking Handshake.

enjoyed becoming a Viking raider, learning how to properly use a shield and throw axes (safely of course). The children worked together brilliantly as a team and developed an ear-splitting war-cry!











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Year Four had a great day at The Royal Armouries on Tuesday and enjoyed looking at the different artefacts in the museum. In the afternoon, the children learnt all about the different weapons that Vikings used in battle, learning how to fight like a Viking. Using the shields and axes was a real highlight for many of the children. The class also had the chance to have a go at axe throwing and then had to show their best angry Viking impression. The children were given the opportunity to watch a live battle between two people using shields and axes which the children thoroughly enjoyed.






































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This week, Year 4/5 visited the Royal Armouries for their topic of the Vikings this half term.

They represented our school brilliantly and asked some fantastic questions whilst looking at the different artefacts.






















