They represented our school brilliantly and asked some fantastic questions whilst looking at the different artefacts.

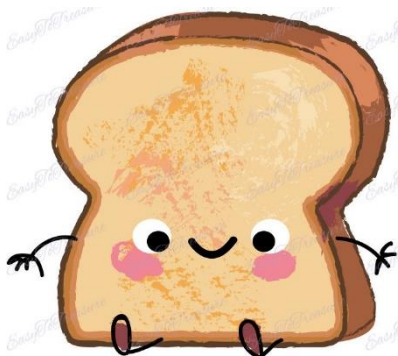

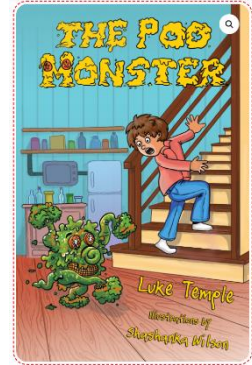

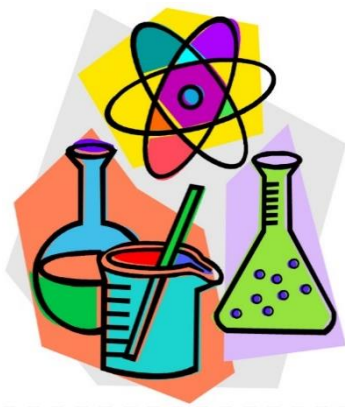
