Our final 'Virtues to Live By' for the Summer term and the academic year are **Wisdom and Discernment.**


Wisdom

We need discernment in what we see and what we hear and what we believe.




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
In our whole school Collective Worship, Year 3 shared the parable of **The Wise Man and The Foolish Man**.




