The winning teams for both classes were the Ruby teams! Well done to all our Reception children!



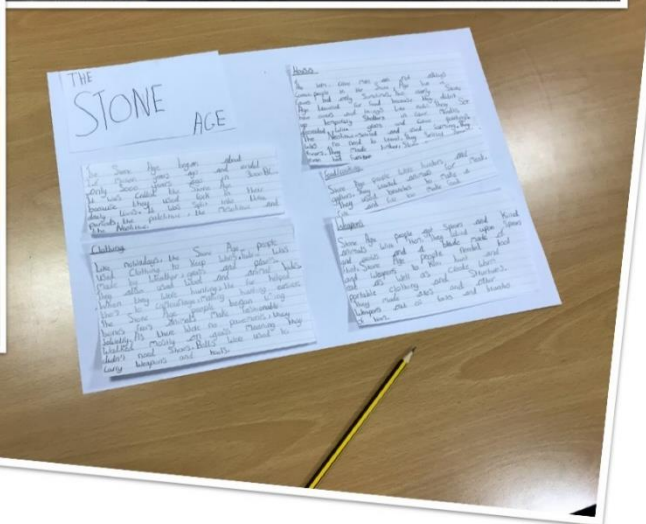
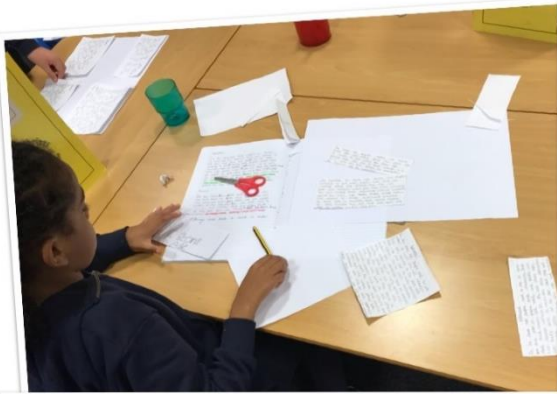

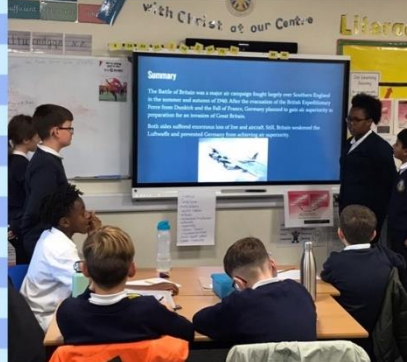
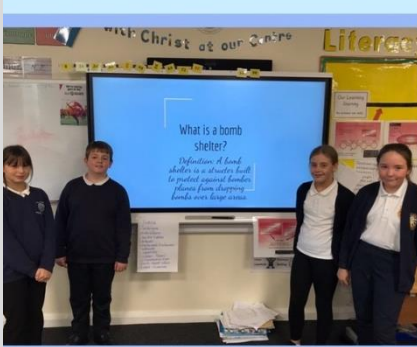
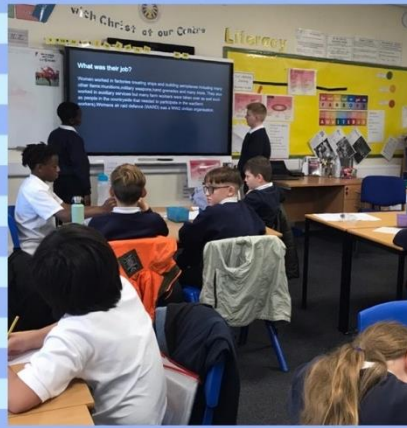
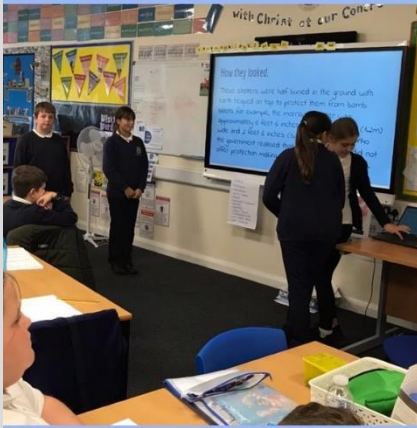
After editing and improving their first draft, the class wrote up their final drafts and included illustrations and captions to make their reports eye-catching for the reader.



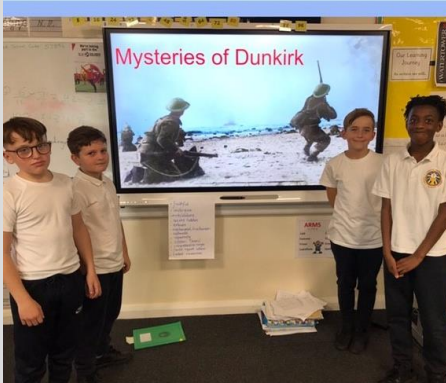
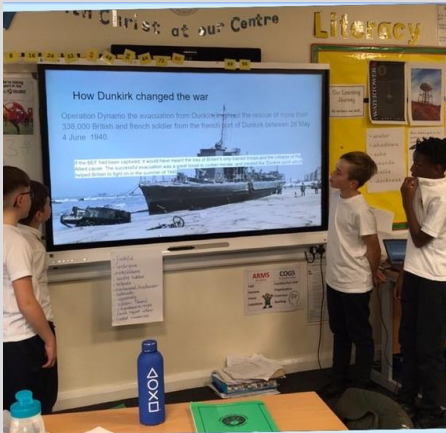


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The children in Year 6 worked as teams to research one aspect of World War Two. They created a PowerPoint presentation to share their expert knowledge with the rest of the class.
