After editing and improving their first draft, the class wrote up their final drafts and included illustrations and captions to make their reports eye-catching for the reader.





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


The children in Year 6 worked as teams to research one aspect of World War Two. They created a PowerPoint presentation to share their expert knowledge with the rest of the class.
















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






This week our School Council met for the first time. They discussed the roles in school and how they represent the voice of pupils across all the classes in school.
