
Catholic Life of the School

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Chalking the door - An Epiphany Blessing

What is chalking of the door?



This is a sign and symbol asking God's blessing upon those who live, work or visit throughout the year to come. Using some chalk write on the outside of your house or inside above the front main entrance.

20 + C + M + B + 23

The letters come from the traditional names for The Three Kings Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. It is also an abbreviation for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this dwelling". The numbers simply refer to the current year.

May we be blessed with health, kindness of heart and gentleness.
Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all.
We ask this through Christ our Lord

Amen.

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Is your information up to date?

Emergency Contacts: If you have changed your mobile, home or work telephone number, please ensure that you report this change to the school office as soon as possible at admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org or by text. In addition, schools are now required to have two sets of contact details per child. Please let us know if you have additional contacts that we may add to your child's records. Similarly, if you have moved house, please update us with your new address. It is of utmost importance that our contact details for you are accurate should we need to contact you in the case of an emergency.

Your Child's Medical Information

It is of utmost importance that the medical information you have supplied us with, is current and up to date. Please inform the school of any new diagnoses or changes in medical conditions, as soon as they happen, so that we can update our health records.

No Nuts in School

We are a nut-free school and we would like to remind all parents/carers and childminders that nuts or food products containing nuts are not allowed to be consumed on school premises.

Attendance

Absence Reporting: If your child is unwell or absent due to any other reason, please communicate this clearly to the school office before 9.30am on each morning of the absence remembering to state your child's name and class. If an absence is not reported, it will be marked as unauthorised.




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How long should you keep your child off school checklist



Should I keep my child off school?



Yes

	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
