



Giovanni, we are humbled...we think you are amazing and thank you and your family for this wonderful, loving act of kindness, especially during this Lenten season!










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What has been happening in school this week

Joanne from Principal Resourcing who chose the winners said, 'It was such a tough decision to make as there were so many excellent entries.'






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Louis Le Prince trailer competition winners
