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The Catholic Church designates November as a special month, to remember and pray for those who have died. The month begins with the feast of All Saints -1st November and the feast of the Holy Souls -2nd November.

November is the month of the Holy Souls

In the Catholic Church's liturgical year, November is the month dedicated to Holy Souls. This means that we remember and pray for those who have died. On November 1st, we celebrated the feast of All Saints Day which is a Holy Day of Obligation so the whole school went to Mass. On this day, we commemorate the lives of holy men and women who have been recognised by the Church as people of virtue- saints.

Pope Francis has said saints, "are not perfect models, but are people whose lives God has crossed," and can be compared with the stained-glass windows of a church, "which allow light to enter in different shades of colour."

Saints are people just like us. They lived good lives, cared for others, prayed and tried to make the world a better place. Father Pat told us that we all have the potential to be saints if we are kind and think of others!

The Month of November reminds us of Jesus' promise that those who believe will never die but be born into new life in Christ. We are reminded of Jesus' promise to Lazarus' sister Martha.

Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. (Jn 11:25-26)

During this month of November, we will pray daily for our loved ones who have died and returned to heaven.

Applications for parents of pupils who will be starting **primary school** in September 2023.

You can apply from 1 November 2022.

The deadline to apply is 15 January 2023.

If you are applying for a place at Corpus Christi Catholic Primary School, please remember to complete and return a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) to the school office in addition to completing the online application with Leeds. You can find the school SIF form on the school website <u>https://www.corpusprimaryleeds.org/key-</u> <u>information/admissions</u>

Please pass this information onto any families or friends who you know might be interested.

Places must be booked so please contact the school office.



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This is a copy of the letter you should receive from School Admissions if you have a child due to start primary school in September 2023. Families do not need a letter to apply for a reception place and can check all dates on the website <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

The closing date is **15 January 2023** and all applications made by that date are treated equally – so there is no benefit in applying any earlier. Please reassure parents who may be worried about this.

Applying for primary school for September 2023

We think your child is due to start primary school in September 2023. You'll need to submit an application to get a place for them.

How to apply

Applications are open between 1 November 2022 and 15 January 2023. You apply by visiting <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. You can apply for any schools, but based on distance your 5 closest schools are:

- 1. School_Name1
- School_Name2
- 3. School_Name3
- School_Name4
- School_Name5

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Before you apply checklist

Apply for 5 schools

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. You'll need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. If a place is available at more than one school, we'll offer you the one highest on your list.

Check if your address gives you a priority for any schools

You can check this on our website. If you live in a school's catchment area, you should include it as one of your preferences.

Read school admissions policies

Each school has its own set of rules which they use to decide which children to offer a place to. This is called their admissions policy.

You should read the admissions policy for each of the schools you want to apply for. This will help you to check what chance your child has of getting a place. Check admissions criteria at <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

Look at the school website

Schools may hold open days. Look at school websites for more information. We will also run some virtual advice sessions on our Facebook page.

Check if you need to provide extra information

If you think your child should get a place due to a specific admissions criteria, you may need to need submit extra information to support your application. You may need to submit extra information if your child:

- has spent time in care (fostered, adopted or looked after)
- needs to show proof of religion
- qualifies for a specific admissions criteria

Tell us if your circumstances change

If there is a change to your circumstances, such as a house move, you will need to tell us and we may need to see evidence of the change. You should look at our website for information or contact us for advice.

Our focus for this half-term is



Leadership – learning to lead others. Supporting, encouraging and developing others to achieve a shared goal.

This skill is relevant not only for individuals in positions of management with formal power, but also for individuals working with their peers in teams.

At the earliest stages, the focus is on basic empathy - understanding their own feelings, being able to share them, and recognising the feelings of others. The focus is on managing dividing up tasks, managing time and sharing resources, managing group discussions and dealing with different opinions. Individuals build their awareness of their own

strengths and weaknesses, and those of their teams. This allows them to allocate tasks effectively. They then build techniques to mentor, coach and motivate others. At the highest steps, individuals will be able to reflect on their own leadership style and understand its effect on others.

Ultimately, they should be able to build on their strengths and mitigate their weaknesses and adapt their leadership style to the situation.

These children have all displayed amazing leadership skills this week.







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What's been happening in school




This week Year 1, Year 1&2 and Year 2 had a visit from Eleanor from Zoolab who brought in some of her wonderful creatures for us.

Well done everyone. What wonderful ambassadors of our school!







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Celebrating Diwali
