The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (7th October).

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us "thumbnails" of the life of Christ and his Mother Mary.

- The Joyful Mysteries are taken mostly from Saint Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus' childhood.
- The Luminous Mysteries bring a deeper understanding to the public life of Jesus. They fill in the blanks between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross.
- The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us.
- The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died-His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother Mary.

The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary and as a school we will be taking part in the Mark 10 Mission Rosary Challenge. Each day, every class will pray a decade of the Rosary. We will listen to a scripture passage and then pray the **Our Father**,

ten **Hail Mary** and finish with the **Glory Be**, paying attention to how God speaks and moves our hearts.

The Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you'll be amazed at the results.


