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The Catholic Church designates November as a special month, to remember and pray for those who have died. The month begins with the feast of All Saints -1<sup>st</sup> November and the feast of the Holy Souls -2<sup>nd</sup> November.

#### November is the month of the Holy Souls

In the Catholic Church's liturgical year, November is the month dedicated to Holy Souls. This means that we remember and pray for those who have died. On November 1st, we celebrated the feast of All Saints Day which is a Holy Day of Obligation so the whole school went to Mass. On this day, we commemorate the lives of holy men and women who have been recognised by the Church as people of virtue- saints.



**Applications for Starting Primary School in September 2023** 

Applications for parents of pupils who will be starting **primary school** in September 2023.

You can apply from 1 November 2022.

The deadline to apply is 15 January 2023.

If you are applying for a place at Corpus Christi Catholic Primary School, please do remember to hand in the Supplementary Information Form (SIF) to the school office in addition to completing the online application with Leeds. You can find the school SIF form on the school website <u>https://www.corpusprimaryleeds.org/key-</u> information/admissions

Please pass this information onto any families or friends who you know might be interested.

Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> December at 5pm.

Places must be booked so please contact the school office once dates are announced.



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This is a copy of the letter you should receive from School Admissions if you have a child due to start primary school in September 2023. Families do not need a letter to apply for a reception place and can check all dates on the website <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

The closing date is <u>15 January 2023</u> and all applications made by that date are treated equally – so there is no benefit in applying any earlier. Please reassure parents who may be worried about this.

### Applying for primary school for September 2023

We think your child is due to start primary school in September 2023. You'll need to submit an application to get a place for them.

### How to apply

Applications are open between 1 November 2022 and 15 January 2023. You apply by visiting <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. You can apply for any schools, but based on distance your 5 closest schools are:

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### Before you apply checklist

### Apply for 5 schools

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. You'll need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. If a place is available at more than one school, we'll offer you the one highest on your list.

### Check if your address gives you a priority for any schools

You can check this on our website. If you live in a school's catchment area, you should include it as one of your preferences.

#### Read school admissions policies

Each school has its own set of rules which they use to decide which children to offer a place to. This is called their admissions policy.

You should read the admissions policy for each of the schools you want to apply for. This will help you to check what chance your child has of getting a place. Check admissions criteria at <u>www.leeds.gov.uk/apply</u>

#### Look at the school website

Schools may hold open days. Look at school websites for more information. We will also run some virtual advice sessions on our Facebook page.

### Check if you need to provide extra information

If you think your child should get a place due to a specific admissions criteria, you may need to need submit extra information to support your application. You may need to submit extra information if your child:

- has spent time in care (fostered, adopted or looked after)
- needs to show proof of religion
- · qualifies for a specific admissions criteria

### Tell us if your circumstances change

If there is a change to your circumstances, such as a house move, you will need to tell us and we may need to see evidence of the change. You should look at our website for information or contact us for advice.

Year 1 and Year 1/2 observed the 2 minute silence in their classrooms.

Remembrance Day 11<sup>th</sup> November 2022

Today is a special day known as Armistice Day, or Remembrance Day. It marks the very day that World War One ended in 1918. A two-minute silence is held at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month to remember those who have died in any conflict so that we can live in peace.

In schoolall the childre held a two minute silence to remember the fallen.

The red poppy symbolises remembrance, hope for a peaceful future and commemorates the soldiers who fought and died in conflict. Poppies were chosen as a symbol because they often grew in the battlefields after the soldiers stopped fighting.

We will remember them.

This week Reception had a walk around the school grounds looking for signs of autumn and evidence of how the seasons have changed. They looked for different coloured leaves to tick off on their checklist. They even found some berries!

<u>Year 3</u> studied rainforests, finding them on maps and exploring what it would be like to live there.

They talked directly to a class of schoolchildren from the Kambeba tribe in Brazil and created some artworks out of natural materials. It was such a memorable day!
















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Year Four had an exciting, informative and inspiring Amazon Rainforest workshop. In the morning the children learnt about the location of the Amazon Rainforest, they wrote about what their dream Amazon Rainforest would be like and then looked at the similarities and differences in the physical geography of a region. In the afternoon they joined a Zoom call with school children from the Kambeba tribe in the Amazon Rainforest and were able to ask them questions. Also, the children shared artworks they had created of an Amazon Rainforest or a forest in the United Kingdom.



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Year 4/5 The class focused on which countries the Amazon Rainforest is spread across, the weather and climate over a year, and the impact the rainforest has across the world.

The children were even lucky enough to live call a classroom in the middle of the rainforest where they were able to communicate with children living there as well as complete an art task.
