The children hunted around the classroom for clues to help them, crack the code for the 'Escape Room'! Everyone worked really hard and had lots of fun.

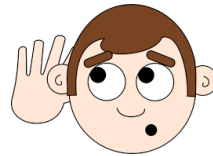
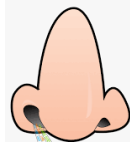

Each child in Year 2 kept a conker to remind them how beautiful and wonderful they are.



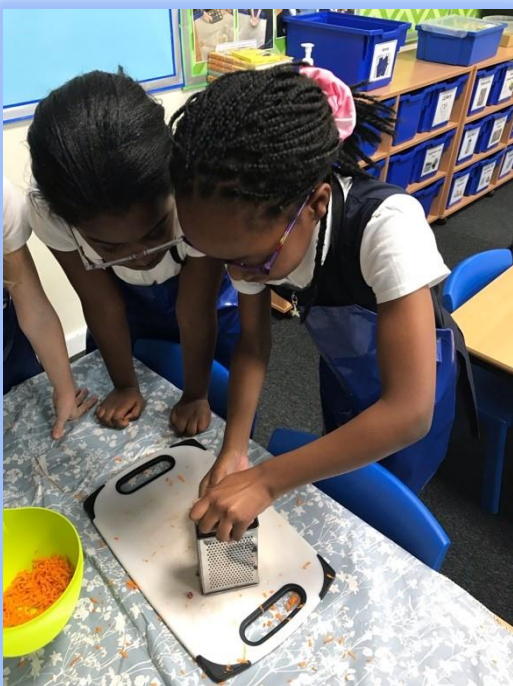
