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This week in **Year 1/2** the children have been very busy. In Art, they have been learning about how to use their bodies to make a Human Alphabet!

In PE, they have been learning how to 'track' others and to find space. They have also been practising about balancing and jumping; the children were able to jump and measure jump by placing a bean bag behind their feet when they had landed. There were some huge jumps! In our Science topic, the children have been learning about animals including humans. This week's lesson focused on the children matching offspring with their adults. The children also expanded their learning by putting the animals into groups of amphibians, mammals, fish, birds or reptiles.





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This week, Year 4/5 worked with Mr. D to create a delicious coleslaw. The children peeled and grated their carrots, apples and cabbage as well as some ginger before adding them to a bowl and mixing with low fat yoghurt.
