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#### School Code of Conduct

At Corpus Christi Catholic Primary School, we provide an environment which gives positive messages about our expectations and values to establish and maintain high standards of behaviour. As a result, we expect our pupils to behave well in school and do as they are asked. We have a code of conduct of six rules which were developed with the children.





#### **School Uniform**

It was lovely to see all of our children returning to school wearing their uniform with pride – they looked so smart! Children should wear suitable school **plain black** shoes. If children wear laces, they must be able to tie them in a double knot independently. Please check regularly that names have not faded following washing. We stress the need to label your child's uniform so as to reduce the amount of lost property across the school and to prevent additional cost to parents. A lost item of clothing is difficult to locate when not labelled. Please make sure that all your child's clothes and belongings are named and checked regularly that they can be read. We really appreciate your cooperation with this. Thank you.



#### PE

A reminder that on PE days children must wear a plain navy tracksuit with their white PE shirt and shorts underneath and plain black trainers.





#### Jewellery/ Hair Styles

No jewellery of any kind should be worn, including earrings. Hair styles should be neat and tidy and not attention seeking or extreme. Long hair should be tied back.



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#### Attendance and Punctuality

There is a clear link between attendance and attainment. The more time a pupil spends in school the more likely they are to improve their opportunity to fulfil their full potential.

Attendance is everything for a successful school year.

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#### Weekly Class Attendance Award

This will begin next week for classes Y1 to Y6 and our two Reception classes the week after. Children with attendance above the school target of 97% will be entered into a monthly prize draw.

#### Sickness and absence

Just to remind everyone that if your child is absent, you will need to phone the school office **before 9.10am** on the first morning of the absence and keep school updated each day thereafter. This will prevent staff worrying about the whereabouts of absent children. It ensures the child's absence has some verification information about the absence by the parent/carer which goes into their attendance files.

#### Home visits

If a child is absent without contact, then school will phone or send a text message. A home visit could be made if a school is not have contacted/a reason for the absence. The home visit could be from a member of the Senior Leadership Team in school or from our new attendance officer Mr Coulson.

#### Medical appointments

Please arrange medical and dental appointments outside school time unless in the case of an emergency. If your child needs to attend a medical appointment during school hours, please call at the school office to 'sign in / sign out' as appropriate. <u>Proof of the medical appointment will need to be shown.</u>

#### **Holidays**

Due to Government law, holidays are no longer authorised. Requests for absence leave must now meet the criteria for exceptional circumstances and **Exceptional Leave forms** must be completed for any requests for absences prior to making any bookings.

As a school, we have personalised our school calendar so our term dates differ from the Leeds City Council school calendar. Dates in bold and highlighted differ from LEEDS Schools holidays Please see the holiday dates for this year to support any arrangements you may need to make on the school calendar given with your child's end of year report in July 2023 or on the school website.
