'They are not gone from us but gone before us.'




During the month of November, we continue to remember and praying for our loved ones who have gone before us in the hope of the resurrection promised by Jesus.

Punctuality

In school we are using a new signing in/out system for late arrivals and early leavers. Late stickers will be given to children arriving late to hand to their teacher and early leavers stickers will be given to children to authorise them to leave school early for appointments etc. This will also allow us to monitor punctuality.

All children should be in class ready to learn by 8.55am. If your child arrives after the start of the school day from 8.55am up to 9.15am they will be classed as late and marked as such in the register. If they arrive after 9.15am, their arrival will be marked as an unauthorised. Please endeavour to get your child in school for learning at 8.55am. Children arriving late lose valuable learning time.

Reception and Reception

Year 1 This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1, the children have been learning about Autumn. They went on an adventure to the field to carry out an Autumn walk. The children had to work carefully to find the leaves that matched the ones on their clipboard and collect them to bring back to the classroom.













Year 1

In Year 1 this week, the children have been continuing their work on instructions. In one of our lessons the children followed instructions to make a jam sandwich. They worked with a partner to butter the bread, spread the jam on the bread and then cut the bread in half. Everyone enjoyed their delicious jam sandwich and did very well at following each instruction.



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Reception/Reception /Year 1 - This week the children learnt how Angel Gabriel visited Mary to share the special news from God that she was going to have a baby. They took turns to act out the story recalling the special words spoken.






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Year 2

Year 2 have been learning about the features of instruction writing. This week they followed some instructions to make a paper plate advent wreath. They understood the importance of writing the instructions in the correct sequence.







The children then planned and wrote their own instructions to explain how to make a paper plate wreath. They made sure they included all the key features of an instruction text.



In PE, the children are practising hitting a target using a beanbag. Throughout the lesson, they used an underarm throw to hit a cone. When they had mastered that skill, they increased the difficulty by moving the target further away!

The bun sales are going to run for the next few weeks where the classes hope to raise money to buy essential items for babies across Leeds.

They gave many examples and techniques of how to ease these situations.

Leeds

Applying for primary school or junior place for September 2024

When and how do I apply?

Applications are open between 1 November 2023 and 15 January 2024 (national closing date). There is no advantage in applying early, all applications made by the national closing date are treated equally.

If you live in Leeds, you apply online at www.leeds.gov.uk/apply.

If you don't live in Leeds, you must apply to your home local authority (whoever empties your bins) but you can still ask for Leeds schools. We will work with other local authorities if you ask for schools in their area.

Do I have to include 5 schools?

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. Asking for only 1 school, or the same school 5 times, does not increase your chances of being given a place at that school.

You need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. Schools don't know your preference order so this doesn't have any impact on whether your child will be offered a place. On offer day if a place is available at more than 1 school on your list, we offer you the highest school on your list.
