Charity (Love of Neighbour)


"This is my commandment,

Congratulations to the children who enrolled on their Sacramental journey at Mass on Sunday 25th February. May God bless them always and be with them as they prepare for the Sacrament of
















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
In History, **Year 1** have been learning about the Great Fire of London. They began by creating a timeline to show how the fire started and the events that happened during the few days the fire took hold. All of the children were really engaged and excited to learn more. They looked at paintings and drawings to help them imagine what it would have been like at that time and afterwards the children learnt a song to help them remember some of the key information from the Great Fire of London. Well done Year 1!

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This week Year 1/2 had a lovely day with our wonderful artist Mrs Robinson. She came into school on Tuesday to assist the children with their final art piece. The children have been exploring primary and secondary colours this half term which they have used to create art pieces in the style of a chosen artist. Year 1 have been focusing on the artwork of Spanish painter and sculptor Joan Miro. Year 2 have been taking inspiration from Swiss-born German artist Paul Klee.









































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As part of their History topic, 'The Victorians', **Year 5** visited Armley Mills in Leeds. They learnt how children spent their day - school in the morning and working in the afternoon for six days of the week. As was the custom at that time, after paying for their lessons, the children completed handwriting, arithmetic and drill exercises with the Victorian teacher who was very strict. In the afternoon, the class had a guided tour of the mill. The guide explained the different jobs that children had to do at the mill in Victorian times. They hopefully realised how lucky they are to be children today!







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This week, **Year 6** visited Armley Mills to learn more about Victorian history. Firstly, they learnt that children had jobs as fillers for half a day in the mills. The guide explained how dangerous it was to work with the factory machines and also about the factory rules such as if the worker was late to work they would not get paid and be given the mundane job of brushing wool into yarns. The Victorian children went to school for half day six days a week. In the school room the pupils dressed up as if they were Victorian children and then took part in a typical Victorian school day of times table, drills and handwriting activities.


