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#### Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

As part of British Science Week **Reception and Reception/Year 1** have been learning about how things grow and change over time. This week the children received a special delivery ... some caterpillars! They observed the caterpillars growing throughout the week. They read 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' to find out how the caterpillars will change over the coming weeks.



Also, after planting their sunflower seeds a couple of weeks ago the children have been verv excited to see shoots starting to appear each day.















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**Reception and Reception/Year 1** led the whole school in their first Collective Worship which was all about St Patrick. The gospel reading from Matthew's gospel told us how Jesus commanded his disciples to baptise people in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The children explained to the rest of school, parents, grandparents and visitors how St Patrick used the shamrock to teach that there is one God who eternally exists as three distinct Persons — the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Finally, they sang 'O be careful little eyes what you see' which teach us to be Christ-like just like the words on St Patrick Breastplate.



Corpus Christi Primary School staff and children will be walking in the parade this Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> March and would love as many of our pupils as possible to join us. There will be lots of fun and activities for everyone, so come along and enjoy the day!



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For the past couple of weeks, the children in Year 1, Year 1/2 and Year 2 have been learning about the historical event of The Great Fire of London. They have researched when, where and how the fire began, how it spread so quickly and how it eventually died out. They have looked at significant buildings which were destroyed and then thought about how they would have rebuilt London by designing their own 'New London'. The children have also been lucky enough to be visited by a historian who helped them recreate a miniature Pudding Lane, where the fire began. During her visit they were able to see how the fire spread so quickly and destroyed parts of London!

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Year 2 have been learning all about 'Growing Things'. They have observed the school environment to find the different types of plants growing on our school grounds.

They have planted bean seeds to learn about the different things seeds need to germinate.





The children also learnt that when potatoes begin to sprout it is called 'chitting'. The potato has then become a seed potato. They looked at the seed potatoes and planted them. As they watch the plants grow, they will talk about all the things a plant needs to be healthy.
