Catholic Life of our School


November is the Month of the Holy Souls.

The month of November gives each of us the opportunity to remember our dearly departed family and friends. We enter their names in our Remembrance Book to remember and pray for them during this month of the Holy Souls.

They shared a reading from the Gospel according to St Matthew (Matthew 25 1-13)

In this Gospel there were ten ladies attending a wedding in the evening. Five of the ladies were wise and took extra oil to keep their oil lamps burning, but the five foolish ones did not. When the bridegroom arrived late the wise ladies could still light the way for him but the foolish ones did not have enough oil for their lamps and so missed the wedding party.

Sometimes things happen that we do not expect and we realise that we are not ready for them. Jesus concluded this Gospel parable with these words,

"Be on your guard, then, because you do not know the day or the hour."

Jesus reminds us to always be ready and prepared to be kind and loving to others whenever we have the chance.

This is fantastic for our pupils who will reap the benefits of being in school every day and learning. A massive thank you to all parents and carers who get the children in and on time every day, all your effort is appreciated.



Punctuality

In school we are using a new signing in/out system for late arrivals and early leavers. Late stickers will be given to children arriving late to hand to their teacher and early leavers stickers will be given to children to authorise them to leave school early for appointments etc. This will also allow us to monitor punctuality.

All children should be in class ready to learn by 8.55am. If your child arrives after the start of the school day from 8.55am up to 9.15am they will be classed as late and marked as such in the register. If they arrive after 9.15am, their arrival will be marked as an unauthorised. Please endeavour to get your child in school for learning at 8.55am. Children arriving late lose valuable learning time.

Year 5 and 6 really enjoyed listening to the selection of instruments and joining in with a sea shanty song.

This term, Year 6 are learning skills to play dodgeball. They worked with a partner first and then learnt some rules of the game. They worked very well in teams communicating with each other on how to be successful.






