






Dear Parents /Carers,

"The Lord is my strength and my song." (Psalm 118:14)












Mission- our faith in action





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Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

This week **Reception and Reception Year 1** have enjoyed learning all about Space. They have learnt lots of facts about each planet and used the inflatable planets to see how they revolve around the sun in our solar system! During the week, the children learnt about what it takes to be an astronaut and were very excited to learn about Neil Armstrong, the first man to land on the moon! On Friday the children were very lucky as they got to go on an adventure to the 'moon' following in the footsteps of Neil Armstrong. It looks like we may have some future astronauts in our midst!

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In computing this week **Year 1** have started creating their own animated story book. They enjoyed exploring the different tools on Purple Mash to design a character for the story and learnt how to save their work so that they can add and make changes to it over the coming weeks. This week in Year 1/2 the children have been very busy learning with all their learning. We are so proud of them coming back with a very grown-up attitude to their work.

The children have been learning about animals including humans in their new Science topic. This week they worked together to group animals in the five main categories fish, birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians. The children created their groups and then discussed the different features of each group for example, fish have scales and breathe through gills in water. Then they moved on to separating animals into their dietary groups and sorted them into carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. The discussed what each group would eat and then talked about humans being omnivores.





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Before the Easter break **Year 2** made Ferris wheels in D.T.

First, they investigated different objects with a wheel and axle and then used their knowledge to help them plan and build their own 'Ferris wheel'.

The children really enjoyed creating their frame and wheel structures and the results were amazing! Well done to our Year 2 budding designers!

Year 3 have created a 'Top Tips Guide' about how to include autistic children and give them support in the classroom. Some suggestions included, giving children space, not to make them feel different and to ask them what they would like to play.





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Year 6 worked together to make healthy pizzas. They learnt that the dough had to be made first and then left as it needed time to rise. Whilst this was happening, the children selected and prepared their toppings. They chose different combinations of toppings including fresh vegetables and cheese to create their own unique pizza. Free School Meals

Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400



This Catering Leeds leaflet sent home with the children this week has lots of information and advice.

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. 
