





On Tuesday four sensory prayer stations for the key events of Holy Week were set up in the hall. Reception, Year 1 and Year 1/2 prepared the Palm Sunday prayer station. Year 2 and Year 3 The Last Supper, Year 3/4 and 4/5 The Crucifixion whilst Year 5 and Year 6 prepared The Resurrection station. Scripture was read at each prayer station and prayers were led by the Chaplaincy Team.







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The children visited the Stations which showed the events from Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. The children were very reverent as they stopped to hear the story for each scene. As they prayed, the children remembered Jesus during this significant week. It was a very special moment when the children cheered "hooray" when they listened to the news of the resurrection.









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We were blessed to come together for the Way of the Cross. A huge thank you to the Chaplaincy Team and Miss Guy who prepared this reverent reflection for us. The Stations of the Cross is a form of prayer used traditionally in Lent. Each of the fourteen Stations retells part of Jesus' Passion, his suffering and death, through images and words breaking it down into stages to reflect upon and remember. This special liturgy is always a very moving reminder of the Easter story and shows us so clearly the message of hope and love which is at the heart of our faith.




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Lent Mass



<u>Palm Sunday</u>

During Holy Week, Year 1 used role play to retell the events of Palm Sunday. They learnt that Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem with people rejoicing and shouting 'Hosanna'. The children made palm leaves, laid down their coats and remembered Jesus' journey. After this, the children were asked to think about how they could welcome Jesus into their lives.



Hot Cross buns are symbolic of the significant day in the Christian faith when Jesus was crucified. Each bun is decorated with a cross made from flour paste to represent the cross on which Christ died. The spices in hot cross buns are said to represent the spices that were used to embalm Christ after his death.





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Year 5 were invited by Corpus Christi College to take part in some Easter activities. Using their Geography field study skills and Mathematical skills, they went on an Easter hunt looking for clues to work out the message - 'Happy Easter'. This was followed by some indoor Easter activities.
