








#### **Shroud of Turin**

This month the replica Shroud of Turin Exhibition is visiting Leeds Cathedral. This week Year 5 and Year 6 pupils went to see the exhibition which featured a full-sized replica of the world-famous Shroud of Turin. The children were blessed to be present for a talk by Pam Moon who explained the features of the shroud and answered any questions the children had. She was very impressed by how much the children knew! Then her husband guided the children through the displays. The children were extremely well behaved and thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Shroud of Turin and how it related to the Easter Story.







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#### Look at what else has been happening in school this week!



As part of the RE curriculum, a whole school assembly was held to learn more about the Hindu faith. It was led by Seema, who spoke about key features of this world religion and the children participated by answering questions, dancing and trying on clothes worn for special occasions. The children were amazed at the length of a sari and Seema then showed them how to put one on. All the children were respectful, listening carefully to our visitor and Seema complimented the children.

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#### Year 1

This week Year 1 took part in some Diwali dancing. Vanessa, our visitor, taught the children a short piece of choreography to some music. The children worked really hard to follow the moves and everyone had a great time. Well done Year 1!





Year 3 welcomed Vanessa who came to teach them all about Diwali which is an important festival in the Hindu faith. Diwali is a festival of lights that celebrates the triumph of light over darkness, good over evil and knowledge over ignorance. Vanessa taught the children some Diwali dance moves and how to Bollywood dance. The children worked well together and really enjoyed performing the different dance moves.



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### Reception and Reception Year 1

The children in Reception and Year 1 also enjoyed the Diwali Dancing workshop. The children copied the moves carefully and joined in wholeheartedly. At the end of the session, they split into two groups and performed the dance for each other.









#### Year 3/4

Year 3/4 enjoyed their session with Vanessa learning about Diwali and performing their Diwali dancing.





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#### Year 1

On Tuesday afternoon the children took part in their first cooking lesson this year. They worked with Miss Gilby to make a 'Crunchy Salad'. The children worked in groups to cut up a variety of different fruit and vegetables such as celery, cucumber and peppers. They used two cutting methods, the claw and the bridge. Every child was able to practise each cutting method to make a group salad. They worked well as a team and all enjoyed their tasty salad at the end of the lesson.











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#### Year 1/2

Last week in Year 1/2, the children had the opportunity to participate in our Classroom Kitchen. The children made a range of veggie snacks. The children practised using their bridge and claw method to cut up the vegetables.

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#### Key Stage 2

On Thursday afternoon, pupils from across KS2 classes took part in a musical celebration. Year 3 and Year 3/4 amazed us with their body percussion and rhythm skills as well as playing the Djembe whilst Year 5 and 6 came together to play their melodicas in unison. The children showed fantastic concentration, focus and confidence to perform. It sounded amazing! 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#### Year 3/4

This week Year 3/4 started their new Geography topic - North America - with an amazing Virtual Reality workshop. The children explored the countries found in North America and identified some of the famous landmarks. This was such a fantastic way to explore the continent. The children were fascinated by the experience.

The children visited Canda, Alaska, New York and California, exploring the Golden Gate bridge, Central Park, The Empire State building and many others. 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### Sporting News



This week's attendance is **97.8%** which is above school's target, a full 1% above last week and a great achievement. Eight classes have reached target this week which is fantastic! #### **Punctuality**

In school we are using an electronic signing in/out system for late arrivals and early leavers. Late stickers will be given to children arriving late to hand to their teacher and early leavers stickers will be given to children to authorise them to leave school early for appointments etc.



This will also allow us to monitor punctuality. All children should be in class ready to learn by 8.55am. If your child arrives after the start of the school day from 8.55am up to 9.15am they will be classed as late and marked as such in the register. If they arrive after 9.15am, their arrival will be marked as an unauthorised. Please endeavour to get your child in school for learning at 8.55am. Children arriving late lose valuable learning time.

#### Applying for primary school or junior place for September 2024

#### When and how do I apply?

Applications are open between 1 November 2023 and 15 January 2024 (national closing date). There is no advantage in applying early, all applications made by the national closing date are treated equally.

If you live in Leeds, you apply online at www.leeds.gov.uk/apply.

If you don't live in Leeds, you must apply to your home local authority (whoever empties your bins) but you can still ask for Leeds schools. We will work with other local authorities if you ask for schools in their area.

#### Do I have to include 5 schools?

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. Asking for only 1 school, or the same school 5 times, does not increase your chances of being given a place at that school.

You need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. Schools don't know your preference order so this doesn't have any impact on whether your child will be offered a place. On offer day if a place is available at more than 1 school on your list, we offer you the highest school on your list.
