
We believe and trust that God will not give up on us.





Liturgical year





At Mass for the first weekend of Advent, the first purple candle on the Advent Wreath is lit. This candle signifies **HOPE** and this candle is sometimes referred to as the Prophecy Candle. During the first week we can have hope for Jesus the Messiah's arrival. We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God.

Let us pray that this season of Advent may fill us all with hope, peace, joy and love as we prepare for the birth of Jesus the light of the world. Amen

Sunday will be the first Sunday of Advent.

The Church's liturgical year begins with Advent -the four weeks prior to Christmas. It is a season of preparation, waiting and anticipation. In church and in school we have an Advent wreath with three purple candles, a pink candle and a white candle. The circle of wreath, which has no beginning or end, is made of evergreens and signifies the everlasting life we find in Christ. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent and one candle is lit each Sunday with the fifth candle, the white one, being lit on Christmas day. The candles also have their own special significance.



Week 1- Hope Week 2- Peace Week 3- Joy (the pink candle)




Week 4- Love

As we enter December and the liturgical season of Advent, we reflect on how we can share love with our neighbour. Please use this calendar throughout the coming weeks as a family.





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Reception/Reception Year 1 In RE this week, the children learnt that Advent is the time when we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus. The children studied the Advent Wreath and talked about the different colour candles and their meanings. They worked together to create their own stain glass Advent Wreath and proudly displayed it in their class window ready for the liturgical season of Advent.























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Whole School Collective Worship

Year 4/5 As we move into the first week of the new liturgical year, Year 4/5 led the Collective Worship about Advent. The children explored a Gospel reading from Mark in which Jesus asks us to look out and keep our eyes open for what is happening around us, so that we are ready when He comes. The children reflected on this by thinking about what Jesus would like us to do if we see people who are sad, lonely, poor or sick.

Year 4/5 finished their Collective Worship by singing "If I were there".

Look at what else has been happening in school this week!



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






Reception/Year 1 This week the children in Reception/Year1 have been exploring the number 5. They have played counting games and sang lots of songs. They used the linking cubes to explore different ways of making 5 and practised writing their numerals to 5.







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




Year 1 have recently continued their work about the weather and seasons by looking at shadows and how they change depending on the direction the light is coming from. They noticed the shadows were longer when the light was closer and they were smaller when the light was further away. They also replicated the sun and could see how shadows changed position too as the sun moved across the sky. After this the children made their own shadow puppet and tested them out.

Year 1/2 This week Year 1-2 received some very special mail. It came all the way from the North Pole! The children were very excited to receive their letter and gift from Santa which was The Polar Express book.

To help with their creative writing the children went on a virtual train journey. They had steaming, hot chocolate (milk and juice) and delicious, fruity Christmas sweets while bobbing along in a cosy, comfy train carriage.





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Year 2

Year 2 have enjoyed learning about 'Wild Weather'. As part of this, the children made windsocks and went outside to observe what happened to the tails of our windsock and to see which way the wind was blowing. They also put out a container to catch the rainfall over the next three weeks.





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Year 3 have written their own Winter poems. They looked at examples and created their own noun phrases, alliteration and similes. The children performed their individual poems speaking with a clear and fluent tone!









Our School Council pupils met with Mrs Ball in their meeting this week to explain how we can keep our school grounds tidy. Mrs Ball loves to keep school grounds litter free and organises litter picks with pupils in our school and the Parish grounds.

In their weekly music lesson this week with Mrs Casavella, Year 6 learnt all about rhythms and reading music. They also listened to some music from The Blues.



Applying for primary school or junior place for September 2024

When and how do I apply?

Applications are open between 1 November 2023 and 15 January 2024 (national closing date). There is no advantage in applying early, all applications made by the national closing date are treated equally.

If you live in Leeds, you apply online at www.leeds.gov.uk/apply.

If you don't live in Leeds, you must apply to your home local authority (whoever empties your bins) but you can still ask for Leeds schools. We will work with other local authorities if you ask for schools in their area.

Do I have to include 5 schools?

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. Asking for only 1 school, or the same school 5 times, does not increase your chances of being given a place at that school.

You need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. Schools don't know your preference order so this doesn't have any impact on whether your child will be offered a place. On offer day if a place is available at more than 1 school on your list, we offer you the highest school on your list.
