

- we are patient with others when they make mistakes.










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

Liturgical year



We continue to be in the season of Advent.

The word Advent comes from the Latin meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation. At mass this second weekend of Advent, the second purple candle on the Advent Wreath is lit. This candle signifies **peace** and is sometimes referred to as the **Bethlehem Candle**. as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem During the second week we are asked to meditate on Bethlehem, the birthday place of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, and therefore the birthplace of the peace of Christ.





Week 1- Hope

Week 2- Peace

Week 3- Joy (the pink candle)

Week 4- Love

Christmas Day- Jesus (white candle)

Let us pray that this season of Advent may fill us all with hope, **peace**, joy and love. Amen



Mission-our faith in action

Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.



During the second week of Advent, we are asked to think about peace. At the birth of Jesus, the angels proclaimed, "Peace on Earth." Sometimes it can be difficult to believe peace is possible when we listen to the news. However, with God everything is possible and this Advent it is especially important for us all to look for opportunities to share the message of peace at home with our families, in our school and in our communities so that God's peace can spread across the world.

In the week ahead, we ask the children to be peacemakers in school, at home and in their community.

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Year 1



The children in Year 3 will soon have the opportunity to begin the preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.









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




Year 2

This week, Year 2 received a present from Santa. They were so excited to receive and read their new book 'The Polar Express'. They acted out going on the Polar Express by collecting their tickets, sitting in their seats, drinking hot chocolate and looking out of the window to think about the things they might see. They then used this to write an amazing setting description.





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Year 3/4

Flat Stanley arrived in Year 3/4 with a letter. He had got lost in New York and wanted everyone to know about it! The pupils imagined they were Flat Stanley and wrote a letter to explain how they were finding New York.















Year 4/5 have been developing their coding skills in their ICT lessons. The children used a coding program to move objects using swipes and clicks. They explored different inputs, outputs and timers and the impact that these would have on their program. They then looked at 'IF statements' and created a command to run if the statement was true or false.





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Year 6 have been working hard to learn key words in their Melodicas lessons such as tempo (speed), allegro (fast) and adagio (slow).

Punctuality

We now use an electronic signing in system to monitor punctuality as children arriving late lose valuable learning time.

If your child arrives after the start of the school day between 8.55am up to 9.15am they will be classed as late and marked as such in the register.

<u>All children</u> should be in class ready to learn by 8.55am. If they arrive after 9.15am, their arrival will be marked as an unauthorised. Please endeavour to get your child in school for learning at 8.55am.

Applying for primary school or junior place for September 2024

When and how do I apply?

Applications are open between 1 November 2023 and 15 January 2024 (national closing date). There is no advantage in applying early, all applications made by the national closing date are treated equally. If you live in Leeds, you apply online at www.leeds.gov.uk/apply. If you don't live in Leeds, you must apply to your home local authority (whoever empties your bins) but you can still ask for Leeds schools. We will work with other local authorities if you ask for schools in their area.

Do I have to include 5 schools?

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. Asking for only 1 school, or the same school 5 times, does not increase your chances of being given a place at that school.

You need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. Schools don't know your preference order so this doesn't have any impact on whether your child will be offered a place. On offer day if a place is available at more than 1 school on your list, we offer you the highest school
