Advent Week 3

This Sunday, the third Week of Advent, is called Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus. On Sunday the pink candle of JOY is lit. It is pink in colour and symbolizes JOY as rose is the liturgical colour for joy. The joy candle is also known as the 'Shepherd's Candle' and it reminds of us the angels who appeared to the unexpecting shepherds to deliver them the good news of Jesus' birth. These shepherds were not anything special in their town and the fact that God chose to tell them about the birth of His Son reminds us that we are all important and special to God.



Let us continue to pray that this season of Advent may fill us all with hope, peace, joy and love. Amen

Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.



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


Road Safety Pantomime



Punctuality

Applying for primary school or junior place for September 2024

When and how do I apply?

Applications are open between 1 November 2023 and 15 January 2024 (national closing date). There is no advantage in applying early, all applications made by the national closing date are treated equally. If you live in Leeds, you apply online at www.leeds.gov.uk/apply. If you don't live in Leeds, you must apply to your home local authority (whoever empties your bins) but you can still ask for Leeds schools. We will work with other local authorities if you ask for schools in their area.

Do I have to include 5 schools?

You should apply for 5 schools to give your child the best chance of getting a place at a school you want. Asking for only 1 school, or the same school 5 times, does not increase your chances of being given a place at that school.

You need to list the schools in your order of preference when you apply. Schools don't know your preference order so this doesn't have any impact on whether your child will be offered a place. On offer day if a place is available at more than 1 school on your list, we offer you the highest school on your list.
