Our mission is to find three simple ways to follow Jesus in the week.



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

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#### Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

This week, Reception and Reception/Year 1 took on The Three Little Pigs STEM Challenge. The children had to find out which was the best material to make a house for the pigs. The children were given some different resources to make their houses, joining them in different ways, before making predictions about what they thought would happen to each house. They spoke about the properties of each material using words such as strong, hard, soft and waterproof.



Then came the exciting part; the children used the role play puppets to retell the story and tested if their houses would blow down. The children showed excellent teamwork and problem-solving skills during this challenge.















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#### Parent and Child Cookery Club

The first session was a great success, with a delicious mac'n' cheese produced by the children and their parents! The children remembered the chopping skills that Miss Gilby has taught them in lessons which they used to chop a variety of 'hidden vegetables' including broccoli, courgettes and corn. The adults assisted with grating and creating the cheese sauce. A fantastic start and we can't wait to see the next dishes!









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This week, in Year 1/2 the children have been learning about money. They have been exploring the coins and notes used in England and the value of each of them. The children have been solving problems, making the same amounts, working out how much money someone has spent and working out how much change they should be given.












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In Maths this week, Year 2 have been learning all about money and trying to make an amount in various ways.






Year 2 pupils also had a special visitor this week. Adele from the Skipping School came to deliver a skipping workshop and taught the children different types of skipping moves in preparation for a competition later in the year.





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This week, **Year 3/4** spent the day with Mr Hepp from Hepp DT this week to complete a DT project. The children made a model with a fully functioning pneumatic mechanism. They linked the design to their Ancient Greece History topic by using warriors and Greek patterns. The children used junior hacksaws, G-clamps and bench hooks to create the model. All the children listened carefully and followed instructions very well to create a working pneumatic product.








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This week, **Year 4/5** were also visited by Mr. Hepp from Hepp DT. The children worked on creating a pop-up product linked to their Ancient Greece topic with a pneumatic mechanism. The children worked with Mr Hepp to design their mechanism and used a range of tools such as a junior hacksaw, bench hooks and G-clamps. Then they assembled their product using the tools and including the pneumatic mechanism which allowed their model to move.


A massive thank you to all parents and carers who get the children in and on time every day.

The ability to use tactics and strategies to overcome setbacks and achieve goals.
