Faith


"For we walk by faith, not by sight."



This week in **Reception and Reception/Year 1** have started learning about Chinese New Year and some of the traditions linked to this celebration from another culture. They have enjoyed role-playing the story in class and making lanterns to decorate the classroom.







In Science **Year 1** have been learning about materials and this week they have used magnets to identify materials that are magnetic. The children looked at a variety of objects testing if they were magnetic and then discovered that the objects that were magnetic were metal. After this they continued to use the magnets to make their own games. They drew a map and had to guide a paper clip around the maze using a magnet underneath the paper. They had lots of fun and enjoyed challenging each other to complete their game.





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In writing the children in Year 1/2 have been focusing on a new book called Dinosaurs and all that rubbish.

It is about taking care of the Earth and links to our Geography topic Climate Change and Pope Francis' 'Laudato Si' message about caring for our common home-planet Earth. The children acted out the story in small groups.










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Year 3/4 have enjoyed exploring circuits in their science topic - Electricity. The children learnt how to make a simple circuit to light the bulb.













This week, **Year 4/5** had their Classroom Kitchen workshop. The children looked at the importance of a balanced diet and the benefits of each category of the Eatwell Guide. They then prepared and cooked a meal designed to include all the categories of the guide. They chopped, sliced and mixed their different ingredients to create a pasta bake. Delicious!



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This week the pupils in school were visited by staff and players from the Leeds Rhinos Foundation. The Foundation staff spoke to the children about how to work as a team and that rugby as a sport is an inclusive one. The two first team players who came were Mikaell Goudemand and Kieran Hudson who then worked with pupils on some rugby drills including passing, moving and scoring a try.

The ability to use tactics and strategies to overcome setbacks and achieve goals.


This skill is about pupils being equipped to manage their emotions effectively, staying motivated and then motivating others, even when facing setbacks.

The early steps focus on identifying emotions, either feeling positive or negative. Following that, if feeling positive, trying to cheer up and encourage others. If feeling negative, having the ability to keep calm and identifying what went wrong.
