Our 'Virtues to Live By' for the summer term are


- Perseverance and Resilience

- Service


Perseverance

Year 1 have practised their map reading skills this week. First, they participated in an enjoyable PE lesson using their orienteering skills to create silly faces with lots of equipment. Then they created an ariel view map of their classroom as part of their Geography work.

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On Tuesday, Year 3, Year 3/4 and Year 4/5 enjoyed a fantastic Maya workshop led by Dr Diane Davies, who is the UK's only archaeologist who specializes in the Ancient Maya. Dr Diane shared her wealth of knowledge on the Ancient Maya as well as showing clips of her archaeological work in the jungle discovering Ancient Maya pyramids.



She also discussed and clarified some common myths. The children looked at a range of artefacts to learn about life in the past. They also made a Maya calendar and explored the Maya sophisticated number system. Dr Diane was so impressed with the children's knowledge and listening skills. She hopes they will join her in the future on an archaeological dig as her budding assistants!

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Year 5 pupils from classes Year 4/5 and Year 5 visited Corpus Christi Catholic College. After an introduction outlining the day, the children experienced different lessons linked to the National Curriculum at high school. In Design Technology they were challenged to build the strongest and biggest construction out of spaghetti. In Science they boiled water using a Bunsen burner and tried different activities in PE. In the RE sessions, they studied scripture and created images to reflect on its meaning before visiting the chapel where some children participated in a Lectio Divina. Through an assembly, Year 5 also learnt more about the Everyone thoroughly College. enjoyed the day and were excellent ambassadors for Corpus Christi Primary.



Our focus for this half-term is




The ability to find a solution to a situation or challenge.

This skill focuses on how to solve problems, recognising that while part of Problem Solving is technical know-how and experience, there are also transferable tools that individuals can develop and use.

First steps focus on being able to follow instructions, then being able to explore problems by creating and assessing options.

Beyond this, exploring complex solutions – thinking about causes and effects then moving to analysis using logical reasoning.

These children have all been amazing at displaying problem solving skills this week.

Crowning of Mary: A May Tradition

For many decades, the lovely words and melody of the hymn <u>Bring</u> <u>Flowers of the Rarest</u> have been gracing the beautiful traditional crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The ceremony has been held in countless parishes, schools and homes throughout the world.

'Bring flowers of the rarest. Bring blossoms the fairest. From garden and woodland and hillside and dale. ...

O Mary, we crown thee with blossoms today,

Queen of the Angels, Queen of the May'.

The crowning is symbolic of Mary as both Queen of Heaven and of our lives.



On Sunday 5th May during the 10.30am mass at Corpus Christi Church, Our Lady's statue will be crowned by the children of the parish in keeping with this tradition. Everyone is welcome to join in the ceremony.







Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400



This Catering Leeds leaflet sent home with the children has lots of information and advice.

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child.
