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Look at what else has been happening in school this week!



Lots of wonderful Maths learning has been happening in **Reception and Reception/Year 1** this week. The children have enjoyed working together as teams to solve problems with doubling and could even write the number sentences to match on their whiteboards. They also enjoyed sorting the Numicon into odd and even numbers. What a super application of Maths learning!









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In PE the children in **Year 1/2** have been looking at orienteering. First, they had to work as a team to look at a map and to try and create funny faces using a range of equipment. The children worked very well together in their teams and they all had a great time using their orienteering skills to create the faces.





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This week **Year 2** enjoyed going on a local walk as part of their geography topic 'Would you rather live in Leeds or Sydney?' The children looked at the human and physical features they could see in the local area. They discussed how the human and physical features would be drawn onto a map. They found lots of human features such as a bridge, road, schools, shops, fish and chip shop. The physical features they spotted were the beck, trees, field, bushes, grass and hill.

Year 2 really enjoyed looking in detail at the area that they live and they will use this information to help them compare Leeds to Sydney in the next few lessons.





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On Monday and Tuesday, the children in **Year 3** and **Year 3/4** had a wonderful lesson with Mr D from Classroom Kitchen.

To extend their learning about 'Maya People' they used traditional Maya ingredients to make a Mexican brown rice and bean dish with a side of

guacamole. The children were able to enjoy a hot chocolate infused with chilli to kick off the Maya Experience. After that, they took turns to cut up fresh vegetables using the bridge and claw method. Once chopped, the vegetables were added to a pan of rice, black beans and spices. Then they moved on to mashing avocado, tomato and lime to create a fresh guacamole!

Each child was offered a tortilla wrap to enjoy a taste of the Maya dishes they had created. It went down a treat and Mr D was very impressed with their knowledge, cutting skills and positive attitudes.

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On Friday, **Year 3 and Year 3/4** had a visit from Rebecca and Charlotte who gave them lots of information surrounding anxiety and worries. They began by discussing the definition of anxiety and how it makes their bodies feel. The children gave some great examples like feeling sick, getting upset, pins and needles in hands and feet and body temperature rising. Some children acted out a scenario to represent 'Flight, Flight or Fight' – the message the brain sends to the body when something happens that makes us feel uncomfortable.





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They also used the 'Stress bucket' analogy to compare their worries and find out what anxieties fill their buckets to the top. Then they spoke about ways to release these anxieties, like going for a walk, speaking to a trusted adult or reading a book. To end the session, they were given different breathing exercises to use if their anxieties ever feel too much.





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This week, **Year 4/5** worked with Classroom Kitchen on some dishes that were linked to their topic of the Ancient Maya.

The class recapped when and where the Maya were from and began the lesson by tasting a Mayan hot chocolate. The children discussed how this tasted different to the chocolate they were used to and explained why this was different.



During the lesson, the children used chopping and mashing to create a guacamole and a Mexican, vegetable and bean rice dish. It was lovely to see all the class involved and trying the different dishes that they made.













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Corpus Christi College held a competition for children to design a poster on how to look after our environment and make our world a better place. The winning poster will eventually be printed and displayed in the local area on lamp post banners.

The Year 10 Wellbeing Group from Corpus Christi Catholic College visited school to announce and present prizes to the runners up and overall winner at our Celebration Assembly. Due to the high quality of entries, there were many runners up over both Key Stages and Jessica was chosen as the overall winner. Well done everyone and especially Jessica!

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Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400



This Catering Leeds leaflet sent home with the children this week has lots of information and advice.

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. The KS2 SATs for all Year 6 pupils will take place between Monday 13th May and Thursday 16th May 2024. It is essential that your child attends school every day.

On each morning of the SATs tests (Monday-Thursday), we will be running a free-of-charge breakfast club for Year 6 pupils only to help prepare and relax them for the day ahead.

If you wish for your child to attend, please ensure they are in school between 8.00am and 8.30am. Access to Breakfast Club will be gained via the main office reception.

We ask all Year 6 children to be in school by 8.30am each morning of the SATs tests, to ensure a calm and smooth beginning to the day for everyone and to ensure a prompt start to the tests.
