Being truthful to others. Being truthful to yourself. Doing what's right regardless of who's around. Being someone others can trust.






Mission- our faith in action

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Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

This week **Reception and Reception Year 1** participated in a Financial Education project. First, they learnt about charities and recapped their understanding about their class charity Water Aid. Then, they discussed how to raise money for their charity and generated some ideas for different activities. They used the ballot box to vote for their favourite activity...the winning activity was baking cupcakes! After that, the children brought their purses, wallets and money boxes into school and learnt about the different coin values. A very important part of their learning was to make a decision whether they were going to spend all their money or save some money for another time. Finally, the children visited their cupcake shop and made choices about their money...spend, save or both. It was a wonderful success and they raised an amazing £28.50 for Water Aid!



















This week Year 1 welcomed Nora's Dad when he visited class to share information all about his job as part of our work for Take Over Day. The children learnt about his special role manufacturing valves in oil refineries around the world and were very impressed with his photographs from lots of different countries. When learning about the importance of safety in his role, the children tried on the safety helmets, glasses and gloves and talked about how to be responsible and safe whilst at work. It was lovely for the children to hear that he was when at school, Nora's Dad worked hard, listened to his teachers and always tried his best. The children all agreed that this is what they do too! We send our thanks to Nora's Dad for volunteering to share his time and for preparing a lovely presentation for the children to give an insight into his interesting job.





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This week in **Year 1/2** the children joined Miss Gilby for their final cooking session of this academic year. They were very excited to share their knowledge and everything they have learnt from this year about healthy eating and how to be even more healthy.

The children then made rainbow wraps using their claw and bridge cutting methods to chop the vegetables. The children enjoyed 'tucking into their own wrap creation'.





Free School Meals

Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. 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Looking After Your Child's Eyes

WHY ARE EYE CHECKS important for CHILDREN?

Children are not always aware when they have a visual problem. Without regular eye checks, visual problems can go unnoticed. This can then have an affect on their development and their education.

The sooner an eye condition is diagnosed, the sooner the treatment and support can be given.

DID YOU KNOW?


All children under 16 and those 16-18 in full time education are entitled to a FREE eye test.

WHICH CHILDREN SHOULD BE TESTED?

Everyone should have regular eye checks, especially those listed below:

- Children with special needs as they can often have eye problems
- Children with a family history of squints or lazy eyes
 - Children with family who have worn spectacles from childhood.
