

A virtue is a good habit that helps us to act according to God's love for us. Every day we have the opportunity to act as a disciple of Jesus.









Reception/Year 1 had their cooking session this week and baked ginger biscuits. They were able to explain that they needed to wash their hands and keep them nice and clean before and during baking. The children took turns to add the ingredients and practised lots of counting when mixing it all together. When the biscuits came out of the oven, everyone enjoyed eating them! It was really lovely to see the children working co-operatively as a team whilst learning new skills.





The children in Reception, Reception/Year 1 and Year 1 were very excited to attend a Science workshop on Thursday. Professor Sophie Sulphate chose some Rocketeers (helpers) to assist her in conducting some experiments with fire, ping pong balls, wind machines and a cannon. Professor Sulphate thought all of the children were super scientists!

During the week the children in **Year 1/2** had a visit from the Internet Safety Wizards. Some children were chosen to dress as the characters from the Safety Team as they learnt about how to be safe online.









The children enjoyed learning spells to remember important details like how to be kind online, how to save things safely and what not to share and also the speak up spell, which taught the children to speak to a trusted adult if they saw something that was not right. The children had a great time learning with Lauren and Mollie the puppet.


The NSPCC leaders were very impressed with the children's knowledge and understanding of the different scenarios they were presented with. during the session. Well done Year 5 and 6!

This week in Year 1/2 the children attended an exciting Science workshop with Professor Sophie. The children were extremely eager to participate in the experiments. She showed the children how they could create explosion without the use of fire.

First, they fired air rockets using force. Next, they made an exploding camera film tub using baking powder and an effervescent tablet. Finally, they had fun trying to keep ping pong balls and beach balls in the air using a hairdryer and a leaf blower. The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit with Professor Sophie and were wonderfully behaved.

They had remembered lots of information they have already learnt about staying safe online. However, they were surprised about the age limits on some of the apps and games that they use!


