


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Mission- our faith in action

Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.


In the week ahead, let us be honest in all we say and do so that others know they can rely on us and trust us.

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St Peter and St Paul

On 29th June (this Saturday), the Catholic Church celebrates the feast day of Saints Peter & Paul. These two saints were contemporaries. Peter was a disciple of Jesus and chosen by Christ to lead the Church. Paul had persecuted Christians, before experiencing a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus and becoming the Church's first great missionary. Through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom, Saints Peter and Paul helped to establish Christ's Church.



Mission Together

Mission Together asks schools to hold a Day of Many Colours on or around the feast of the Church's great missionaries St Peter and St Paul on 29th June. The Day of Many Colours is based on the five colours of the <u>Mission Rosary</u>, and encourages our children to unite in prayer with our sisters and brothers around the world in Africa, the Americas, Europe, Oceania and Asia. The aim is to develop in our children a missionary spirit of attention towards others, through prayer, charity, and action.





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Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

This week Reception and Reception Year 1 have been consolidating their learning in Maths by completing repeating patterns. The children have completed moving patterns such as stamp, stamp clap, colour patterns. Then they progressed onto shape patterns. Their focus activity this week was to complete ABC, AAB or ABCD shape patterns.





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On Tuesday afternoon **Reception/Year 1** went to visit Mrs H from Classroom Kitchen. They talked about what they would like to put into an ice-cream sundae. Then they discussed how if they put in lots of fruit and some yogurt then it would be healthy and delicious too.





They cut up their own fruit using the bridge and claw method and placed the fruit into their cup. Mrs H added some yummy ice-cream, yoghurt and a drizzle of honey and chocolate sauce. They really enjoyed eating them on such a hot day!





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Some of our children had an adventure to the Vinery Centre for soft play and to complete sensory circuits. They were exceptionally wellbehaved and really enjoyed a fun visit but were very tired when they got back on the minibus to come back to school.



We must listen to instructions carefully – to make sure that we do exactly what is being expected, so that we don't make mistakes or place ourselves into situations of danger.


We have to listen to instructions in many different parts of our lives: whether we are being taught something new, being given a job to do, or just completing tasks in our wider lives.

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Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child.
