Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.




We trust that God's love has no end and that He is at work in our lives and in the world.



#### Remembrance Day – 11<sup>th</sup> November

The first Remembrance Day was held in 1919 at 11 am on the eleventh day of the eleventh month throughout Britain and the Commonwealth. Originally it was called Armistice Day and commemorated the end of the hostilities of The Great War 1914-1918. It came to symbolise the end of the war and provides an opportunity to remember those who have died. Therefore, on Monday at 11 am the whole school observed the two-minute silence to remember those who have given their lives in battle. Pupils in Key Stage 2 held their two-minute silence in remembrance of all who had died during the war-family, friends, Parish and in the wider world in the playground. As always, the children were respectful and reverent in honour of the fallen! They were an absolute credit to themselves, their families and our school.



## Several Times On



Our focus Skills Builder skill is....



Creativity is the complement to Problem Solving and is about generating innovations or ideas which can then be honed through the problem-solving process.

The first few steps focus on the child's confidence in imagining different situations and sharing their ideas.

The focus is then on generating ideas - using a clear brief, making improvements to something that already exists and combining concepts.

The children then apply creativity in the context of their work and their wider life.

These children have all displayed amazing creativity skills for this week.

#### Look at what else has been happening in school

#### Autumn walk

This week in classes **Reception** and **Reception/Year 1** the children have learnt about autumn. They learnt all about the weather in autumn and how the leaves fall off the trees and change colour. Next, they went on an autumn walk looking for signs of autumn. They found leaves of different shapes and sizes and ticked them off on their observation sheet. They particularly enjoyed marching through the leaves to hear the crunching as well as throwing the leaves high into the air. The children had a wonderful time!







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This week, the children in class **Year 1** have continued their work on instructions. They recalled the features of instructions. Then they followed a set of instructions to make a jam sandwich. They followed each step one by one. Finally, they wrote their own instructions.





In History, class Year 1 have started their next r topic on: 'Who are our nursing heroes?' The children looked at different photographs of nurses to think about the job that they do. Then they looked at three nurses in the past who were very important. They cannot wait to find out more about them.



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This week the children in class **Year 2** were lucky enough to work with Mrs. Gilby-Young from Classroom Kitchens. This time the children made fruit smoothie, either choosing a tropical flavour or a berries flavour. The children used their bridge and claw cutting methods to chop their fruit, before blending their mixture. Their next decision was to decide if they wanted to try their smoothie with milk or fresh orange juice. The children were very impressed with the flavour combinations.









#### **David Hockney inspired Landscapes**

Mrs Robinson, our school artist, worked with class **Year 2/3** to support the development of exploring lines and blending using pencils, pastels, chalk and oil pastels. The children researched the artist David Hockney and used his landscape artwork as inspiration for their final piece.









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This week class **Year 3** have worked with our artist Mrs Robinson to create the most beautiful paintings. The children studied the famous artist Vincent Van Gogh and his work then painted their own 'Starry Night' piece.











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This week, as part of their swimming lessons, the children in classes **Year 4 and Year 4/5** learnt about how to stay safe in the water and how to rescue someone using a help signal. They discussed real life situations where they might need to help someone who is in danger in the water. The children were even allowed to wear their pyjamas in the pool to replicate what it would be like in a real-life situation!





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As part of the music curriculum, the children in **Year 4/5** enjoy a weekly music lesson. This week, the children enjoyed using the glockenspiels to perform a piece of music as a class. The children all took on different parts. The teachers were very impressed with the final performance!





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Year 6 took part in a minute of silence to honour all those who died in service for our country.





For anti-bullying week the children in Year 6 came to school wearing odd socks to show that everyone is different. After the School Council's assembly, the children discussed what bullying is, about the importance of choosing respect and learnt 'STOP' (Several Times On Purpose).
