Sunday is The Solemnity of Christ the King which marks the end of the Church's liturgical year.

In our Whole School Collective Worship, we listened to the words in John's Gospel (John 18:33-37) when Jesus told Pilate, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world.'

Although we may think that the way we live is nothing like that of a king, we are also reminded that Jesus' kingdom is not of this world. It is a kingdom filled with love for others, justice, mercy and peace and that we can try to reflect this kingdom in our daily lives by following in Jesus' footsteps. This links beautifully with our display in the school entrance 'Christ has no body but yours'. It also reminds us of the importance of appreciating the important things in life. Ralph Waldo Emerson, an American 19th century writer and poet, said: "May we give thanks for each new morning with its light, for rest and shelter of the night, for health and food, for love and friends,

We trust that God's love has no end and that He is at work in our lives and in the world.






<u>A Snowy Day</u>

Children from **Reception and Reception/Year 1** enjoyed playing with the snow in class this week. They added animals to the tray and developed their imaginary play whilst all workina together.









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As part of our History topic, the children in **Year 1** had a visit from 'Florence Nightingale'. She told them a story about how she became a nurse and trained the children to become nurses. They sorted items into things that would have been in the dirty hospital in Scutari and things that would be used in the cleaner hospital after Florence Nightingale arrived.

They also created a timeline to show important facts about Florence Nightingale.





The children then pretended to go back in time and became porters and nurses at the hospital in Scutari in 1854.





This half term the children in **Year 2** are looking at the topic of Light and Shadow in their Science lessons. They have learnt about 'What is dark?', 'How does light travel?' Their latest practical work was about 'What is reflection?' The children entered a dark cave to find out what colours they could see best in the dark cave and then they discussed how and what reflection is. They discovered that they were able to see the brighter, shiny colours and of course the reflective material used on a high visibility jacket. The children discovered that light travels in a straight line from the source of light and hits the object and bounces back to their eyes. They also learnt that if the colour is dark the light is absorbed.
