

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LITURGICAL CALENDAR



We may have taken down and packed away the Christmas decorations but this Sunday actually marks the end of the Christmas season in the Church. Roman Catholics (and some other Christians) celebrate the end of the liturgical Christmas season with the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which falls on the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany. Ordinary Time will begin on Monday- the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

In the Sunday Gospel, we meet Jesus on the bank of the River Jordan. He has just been baptised by John the Baptist when suddenly the heavens opened and God the Father spoke some amazing words over Jesus.

> "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."



God the Father speaks these same words over each one of us and loves each of us just as much as He loves Jesus. What a powerful message!



A huge well done Year 5/6!






