#### Four Figures

The four figures represent the 'four corners of the earth' and all humanity. They are embracing each other, showing solidarity and support for each other. They and we are a united people. The figure at the front is clinging to the cross.



#### A Ship

The people make up the body of the ship. This shows that together we are the Church. We are journeying together led by the cross of Christ.

#### Waters under the boat

The waters are choppy. This acknowledges that our pilgrimage of life will not always be calm. The tidal waves bring us to many different highs and lows but God is always with us throughout all the events in our lives.



#### The Mast

The mast is the cross. It bends to cover the people and is leaning into them. The cross is not straight but bends in to meet us. The cross gives us the reassurance of hope and reminds us that we can be certain of God's presence with us always.

#### The Anchor

The anchor is a symbol of hope. When we trust in God, He will hold us steady in the midst of the waves.

The name 'Hope anchor' is given to the spare anchor used on all boats for emergencies and to keep the boat steady during storms.



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A member of staff from Corpus Christi Catholic College presented the Jubilee Logo canvas to our Chaplaincy Team as it travels on its pilgrimage around the 93 Catholic schools in the Diocese of Leeds.



Then our Chaplaincy Team led the whole school in a beautiful liturgy to welcome the Jubilee Logo Canvas to our school. We added our school logo to the canvas as a record of its pilgrimage to the school.







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Finally, some members of our Chaplaincy Team travelled to St Patrick's Primary School to hand over the Jubilee Logo canvas for the next part of its journey.






#### Mission-our faith in action

### Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.


In our whole school collective worship, we listened to the Gospel from St Luke (Luke 5:1-11).

We also reflected on how blessed we are to always have God to turn to and rely on especially when we experience difficulties and challenges.




Our focus Skills Builder skill is....Positivity



This skill is all about individuals being equipped to manage their emotions effectively and being able to remain motivated, and ultimately to motivate others, even when facing setbacks.

Year 1 and Miss Laxton are the only class this week to reach 100% so a massive CONGRATULATIONS to them. Well done Year 1!


We also had some high scores in most of the other classes which is great news.




#### **Punctuality**

#### Look what has been happening in school.

This week school had a visit from professional musicians Caroline and Del who teach music and enjoy sharing their musical enthusiasm with children.

They play the harp, piano, violin, viola, flute, piccolo, clarinet, recorder and saxophone. They visited different classes and here are their photos.



Reception and Reception/Year 1 enjoyed their live music workshop with Cresta this week. They enjoyed listening to the musicians as they played a variety of instruments - violin, clarinet, saxophone, harp and piano. The children joined in singing and dancing and playing instruments too. It was a lovely experience for all involved and our visitors were impressed with such great audience participation.







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The children in Year 1 listened to different pieces of music and learnt the names of the instruments that were played during each piece. Then they enjoyed making a soundscape. A soundscape is created by using different instruments to represent the sounds of various environments. For example, making a soundscape of the forest with the sounds such as a woodpecker or rustling leaves. To do this the children used their voices, a plastic bag with pieces of paper in, a guiro and coconut shells.









This week, Year 4/5 enjoyed a cooking lesson where the children learnt all about Mediterranean food. The class discussed what food is eaten in the Mediterranean and why. They also discussed the health benefits of eating certain types of food. Year 4/5 then made their own vegetarian paella. The children were very happy with the results and enjoyed eating their creation.

### Dave from d:side visited our school this week.

**Year 1** discussed internet safety and how to stay safe on the internet using the three rules which can be seen on the photographs.

All pupils took part in a Choices workshop which allowed everyone to consider choices they would make linked to social media, peer pressure and consent. After working alongside Leeds United staff in the media suite they were then given a tour of the stadium.
