

- * Living simply helps us put more trust in God.







Staying Positive

The ability to use tactics and strategies to overcome setbacks and achieve goals

Our focus Skills Builder skill is....Positivity

This skill is all about individuals being equipped to manage their emotions effectively and being able to remain motivated, and ultimately to motivate others, even when facing setbacks.

The early steps focus on identifying emotions - particularly feeling positive or negative. Building off that is the ability to keep trying - and then staying calm, thinking about what went wrong, and trying to cheer up and encourage others.

These children have all displayed amazing positivity skills for this week.









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This week, as part of their Geography work, Year 4/5 have been thinking about the negative impact burning fossil fuels has on the environment. The class discussed a range of renewable energy sources including solar panels and wind turbines. The children worked in groups to find advantages and disadvantages to using renewable energy sources.

On Safer Internet Day, Year 4/5 discussed how they can stay safe whilst using the internet and the importance of making good choices online. The class discussed how the internet can be a fantastic resource but that it is very important to keep ourselves safe online; the children came up with a range of ideas to stay safe online including: not sharing personal information, asking permission before downloading any apps and speaking to a trusted adult if they are worried about anything online.





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On Thursday pupils in Year 3 and Year 4 delivered a djembe performance. The performance demonstrated the pupils' ability to listen carefully, follow the beat and work collaboratively to create a dynamic and engaging concert for parents, carers and family members. The pupils showed great enthusiasm and confidence, highlighting their musical progress and commitment. Thank you to all the parents and carers who came to watch.


