



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As part of our 'Other Faiths' week we invited our visitor Robert in again to talk to the pupils about Judaism. Robert spoke to us about his faith and the Jewish religion.



The younger children were delighted to welcome **Robert** back. He shared fascinating facts about Jewish traditions and practices, especially helping the children learn more about the Passover feast. He brought a variety of e Passover Seder plates to show the children. The Passover Seder plate is a special plate containing symbolic foods eaten or displayed at the Passover





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Robert spoke to Key Stage 2 about being a member of the Jewish faith. He explained about the Feast of the Passover and made links with Jesus and the Last Supper.





The children looked at a Seder plate and discussed with Robert what the meal involved. Then, they read out the questions which would be asked at the meal and sang them in Hebrew. The children were fascinated by the Matzo bread he bought to show them.









**Year 5/6 and Year 6** joined the Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal with Canon Pat for Adoration in Corpus Christi Catholic Church. The children had time to reflect in silence on the Bible readings before finishing with singing God's praises.





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This week, **Year 2/3** had an exciting cooking session with Classroom Kitchen where the children made delicious bruschetta! The children practised the bridge and claw methods for safely chopping, working with a variety of fresh ingredients like plum, cherry, and salad tomatoes, onions, and fresh basil.

After dicing the ingredients, the children topped toasted with their vibrant bread mixture, finishing it off with some melted mozzarella cheese. The results looked very colourful and mouthwatering delicious even if there were some mixed reviews! Some loved the dish while others were a little unsure. but everyone gave it a try!













This week, **Year 4** enjoyed their singing lesson with Miss Leather. The children firstly warmed up their vocal cords before rehearsing a range of hymns. The children did a wonderful job particularly when singing in Latin and were focused throughout the lesson.



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### Medical and dental appointments

Please book **routine medical and dental appointments** out of school hours or during school holidays in order not to disrupt your child's education.

Where this is unavoidable, please send a copy or photo of the appointment to the school office via email <u>admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org</u> at least three days before the appointment date.

We must have proof of your child's appointment to cover the absence. Alternatively, you must call into the school office at least three days before the appointment date and give in the information required.

In the email please also include the time you will need to collect your child.

On the day before the appointment, please send a Class Dojo or Tapestry message to your child's class teacher with the time your child is to be collected so that the teacher knows what time to send them to the school office.

If arrangements change or the collection delayed, please contact the school office so that your child can remain in class.
