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The 40 days of Lent are based on two accounts: the 40 years of wandering by the Israelites and our Lord's 40 days in the wilderness at which point He was tempted by Satan.

Lent draws its inspiration from the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert. The Gospels tell us that after his baptism, Jesus fasted in the desert and then was tempted by the devil. He resisted these temptations and then went to Galilee to begin his public ministry.

Lent is an ancient English word meaning 'Springtime' and so it is a good time to 'spring clean' our lives by praying, fasting and carrying out acts of love so that we can truly be ready to celebrate Easter.

Fast from grudges and be reconciled.


Fast from **words** and be silent so you can **listen**.





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On Wednesday, which was Ash Wednesday, we began the season of Lent remembering that God so loved the world and each one of us that he sent us his only Son to live and die for us.



Year 5/6 led the whole school and the Parish community at Mass for Ash Wednesday. The pupils read reverently and all the children led the congregation in beautifully singing the hymns.





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During Lent, the Alleluia is not sung during Mass or collective worship. The Chaplaincy Team locked away the Alleluia in each classroom to await the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter.





















PANCAKE PRAYERS

So why do we make pancakes on Shrove Tuesday?

Lent is the period of six weeks leading up to Easter. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends during Holy Week. It lasts a total of forty days, not including Sundays. The idea of Lent started in the fourth century – a long time ago. Back then baptisms took place at Easter.

The forty days of Lent gave people time to prepare for their baptism, and often they fasted - went without food to help them think about what they were about to do. Other members of the church would fast too. Gradually Christians began to associate the fast with the 40 days when Jesus went into the desert to fast and pray in preparation for his ministry.

The day before Lent starts is Shrove Tuesday. We also call it Pancake Day. Traditionally Christians gave up meat, fat, eggs and dairy products for Lent. (Today people often give up things like chocolate and crisps.) This was the last chance to use up these foods before Lent began.

So, in preparation for Lent and Easter, let's mix up some pancake batter – and share pancakes!

Mixing the pancake batter:

When we make pancakes, and we think about the mix.

We come to God as we are: some bits good, some bits bad. We are not always sure what is right and what is wrong – we're here together in a mixture called life.

So we sift in some flour, smoothing out the lumps and bumps: the things we regret and the wrong things we have done.

We add a pinch of sugar, to make the ordinary better – with God's love. We mix in some milk because we all need strength for our journey with God.

We add an egg, symbol of new life, and look forward to new possibilities. We mix it all together, using up the ingredients of the past to give us the energy to move on towards the future, as we journey together through Lent to Easter.

God, may this food we share give us strength to survive in the tough times: may we walk on into Lent ready to face whatever comes our way.

God, may we never forget all those in the world who are hungry

God, give us hunger for justice – and for more of your good stuff!

God, as we eat these pancakes, help us to remember that it's the mix and variety that makes life really interesting – different people, different experiences, different views. So, help us to choose our pancake toppings with a spirit of adventure, experimentation and fun.



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On Tuesday great fun was had with children having a go at flipping pancakes and then choosing a yummy topping to taste them!





















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




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HAPPY PANCAKE DAY



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Government and NHS advice on when to keep your child off school





Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


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Corpus Christi Primary will be walking in the Parade and it would be wonderful if anyone could join in and walk with us - all welcome to join in this fun day!
