




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Charity means

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

Our focus Skills Builder skill is....**Problem Solving**The ability to find a solution to a

situation or challenge



This skill focuses on how to solve problems, recognising that while part of Problem Solving is technical know-how and experience, there are also transferable tools that individuals can develop and use.

The first steps focus on being able to follow instructions to complete tasks, seeking help and extra information if needed. The next stage focuses on being able to explore problems by creating and assessing different potential solutions. This includes more complex problems, without a simple technical solution.

These children have all displayed amazing **problem solving** skills for this week.










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As part of Science Week, we invited a science teacher into school from the Leung Fair Start Foundation to work with our KS2 children. The Leung Fair Start Foundation is a charity that our school is working with to enhance our science teaching.

The focus for Science Week this year is 'Change and Adapt' so our children carried out experiments to find out what a firework is and look at combustion. The children closely observed what happened when they pulled a party popper, lit a sparkler and set off a bang snap. They recorded what they saw, smelt and heard. The children thoroughly enjoyed the session and were able to show an amazing knowledge of science.



Medical and dental appointments



Please book **routine medical and dental appointments** out of school hours or during school holidays in order not to disrupt your child's education.

Most routine medical appointments are relatively short so your child should be in school before and/or after their appointment where possible. A whole day off is rarely needed.

We must have proof of your child's appointment to cover the absence from school.

Where it is unavoidable to book out of school hours, please send a copy or a photo of the appointment to the school office via email admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org at least three days before the appointment date.

Alternatively, you must call into the school at least three days before the appointment date and give in or show text information to school staff of the appointment.

Please also inform school the time you will need to collect your child.

On the day before the appointment, please send a Class Dojo or Tapestry message to your child's class teacher with the time your child is to be collected so that the teacher knows what time to send them to the school office.

If arrangements change or the collection is delayed, please contact the school office so that your child can remain in class and not lose valuable learning time.






BOOK FAIR
