

Laetare Sunday

This Sunday marks the midpoint of Lent and is known as Laetare Sunday. Laetare means to rejoice. The day takes its name from the opening words of Sunday's Mass, 'Laetare, Jerusalem'- 'Rejoice, O Jerusalem'. The priest wears rose vestments which signify joy. Although we are still during a time of penance and fasting, midway through Lent the Church reminds us that we have reason to be happy because the time of Jesus' resurrection is near!

Mary, Our Mother – we strive to follow your faith in God and show love and care to everyone.



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




In the next lesson, the children looked at non-fiction texts and picked out the key features they would find. They will use this information when they write their own nonfiction text.


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

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
This week, **Year 4** and **Year 4/5** have been selling toast to the whole school as part of our Lenten fundraising. They have raised an amazing £133!

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

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

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Medical and dental appointments

Please book **routine medical and dental appointments** out of school hours or during school holidays in order not to disrupt your child's education.

Most routine medical appointments are relatively short so your child should be in school before and/or after their appointment where possible. A whole day off is rarely needed.

We must have proof of your child's appointment to cover the absence from school.

Where it is unavoidable to book out of school hours, please send a copy or a photo of the appointment to the school office via email <u>admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org</u> at least three days before the appointment date.

Alternatively, you must call into the school at least three days before the appointment date and give in or show text information to school staff of the appointment.

Please also inform school the time you will need to collect your child.

On the day before the appointment, please send a Class Dojo or Tapestry message to your child's class teacher with the time your child is to be collected so that the teacher knows what time to send them to the school office.

If arrangements change or the collection is delayed, please contact the school office so that your child can remain in class and not lose valuable learning time.
