






Mission-our faith in action

In the week ahead, let us have the strength and courage to say sorry and to forgive others for their mistakes.



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

Forgiveness means


letting go of anger toward someone who hurt you and to think, feel, or act with kindness toward that person.

Our focus Skills Builder skill is.... **Problem Solving**The ability to find a solution to a situation or challenge

This skill focuses on how to solve problems, recognising that while part of Problem Solving is technical know-how and experience, there are also transferable tools that individuals can develop and use.

The first steps focus on being able to follow instructions to complete tasks, seeking help and extra information if needed. The next stage focuses on being able to explore problems by creating and assessing different potential solutions. This includes more complex problems, without a simple technical solution.

These children have all displayed amazing problem solving skills this week.















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Reception and Reception/Year 1 went on a Spring Walk this week. They noticed signs of spring as they explored outside - leaves are now starting to grow, bees are flying around and the birds are singing. The children loved visiting the daffodils and remembered planting the flower bulbs earlier this year. They sat together and sketched the wonderful nature in God's world.





Children from Reception and Reception/Year 1 have really enjoyed outdoor play activities this week. They have buried and found toys in the sand, followed a race track with cars, built and used a train track and played with the foam. It has been lovely to see them playing alongside each other and sharing all of the toys.














Medical and dental appointments



Please book **routine medical and dental appointments** out of school hours or during school holidays in order not to disrupt your child's education.

Most routine medical appointments are relatively short so your child should be in school before and/or after their appointment where possible. A whole day off is rarely needed.

We must have proof of your child's appointment to cover the absence from school.

Where it is unavoidable to book out of school hours, please send a copy or a photo of the appointment to the school office via email admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org at least three days before the appointment date.

Alternatively, you must call into the school at least three days before the appointment date and give in or show text information to school staff of the appointment.

Please also inform school the time you will need to collect your child.

On the day before the appointment, please send a Class Dojo or Tapestry message to your child's class teacher with the time your child is to be collected so that the teacher knows what time to send them to the school office.

If arrangements change or the collection is delayed, please contact the school office so that your child can remain in class and not lose valuable learning time.
