




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Key Stage Two children celebrated their last Adoration in Lent with the Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal and Canon Pat.

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This week all the children across school took part in a range of activities linked to Holy Week. Outside the children prayerfully participated in the event that lies at the heart of Christianity – Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection through the Stations of the Cross. They also visited sensory prayer stations set out in the hall which explained the events of Holy Week and the first Easter Sunday. The sensory prayer stations began with Palm Sunday, then went on to see the depiction of the Last Supper where the children were able to share Jesus' words "This is my body, do this in memory of me' and 'This is my Blood, do this in memory of me' linking these words with the Last Supper and the Eucharist in Mass. They were reverent when listening to how Jesus was put to death on the cross and were able to say that He died to save us. They joined in prayer when they reached the final station of the Empty Tomb and were delighted to know that this meant that Jesus had risen!

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The children prayed the Stations of the Cross. Each of the 14 Stations retell part of Jesus' Passion (his suffering and death) through images and words. These Stations of the Cross introduce children to Jesus' Passion, breaking it down into stages that they can reflect on and remember.





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


